What Size Wins Bulli Cup

What Size caused a boil over in Bulli's blue ribbon event proving too good in last Monday night's Group 2 Bulli Gold Cup.

Trained by champion Victorian mentor Jason Thompson, What Size may have started at a double figure quote in the star-studded Bulli decider, but the son of Hallucinate belied his price in leading throughout (from another wide draw in seven).

What Size (\$21.10) clocked a fast 26.02 after quick sections of 9.93, 19.49 and a run home of 6.53. He defeating Golden Easter Egg runner-up He Knows Uno (\$3.60) by two and a quarter lengths.

Wally Lutiger's talented Fancy Dean (\$5.00) secured a late call-up to the Gold Cup as the first reserve and the lightly raced prospect acquitted himself well in elite company, running third, three and a half lengths behind What Size.

Ken and Mary Wright's Noble Pedro set the qualifying standard for the Bulli Gold Cup, with a brilliant 26.17 but he was brought undone by box five in the final.

After the placed runners the field finished in the following order 4th Mojito (\$9.40), 5th Penthouse (\$12.00), 6th Bralyn County (\$16.70), 7th Noble Pedro (\$6.30) and Elite Blue Size (\$4.10).

What Size is a Black dog whelped March 2008 by Hallucinate from Still Hoping (Placard x Magic Trick). He is raced George & Tony Alvaro and trained by Jason Thompson in Victoria. What Size has won 20 of his 71 starts and has been placed on 21 occasions with the \$25,000 first prize for the Bulli Gold Cup it took his current stake earnings to \$77,790.

The Bulli Gold Cup was formerly known as the South Coast Cup and was first conducted in 1999 as the Cyril Rowe Memorial commemorating the service and contribution to the greyhound industry of the late Cyril Rowe the former GBOTA Chairman. Listed below is honour roll of the past winners in a most unusual occurrence Winsome Lesson winner in 2006 is from two previous winners History Lesson and Winsome Dollars. The Cup was sponsored for a number of years by the Cabra-Diggers Club and the last three years by Ranvet.
