Tassie Gun the one to beat in Group 1 Hume Cup final

The Kel Greenough-trained Jethro looks the greyhound to beat in the Group 1 Hume Cup at The Meadows on Melbourne Cup eve after a stunning eight and three quarter length heat win in 34.59.

The son of Head Bound and It's A She again began slowly before unleashing the most powerful finishing burst of the night, running home in a sensational 12.05 to stamp himself as the greyhound to beat in Monday week's \$75,000-to-the-winner final, despite drawing box five.

Andrea Dailly goes into the final with two chances after impressive efforts from Franklin Hero (34.55 best of night heat win) and Lektra Jay, who was outgunned by young star Langi Bale.

Grand chaser Don Chendo will be looking to push his prizemoney to over \$275,000 if victorious in the final after an all-the-way 34.61 victory in the first heat of the night. The son of Where's Pedro and Kilby Supreme has won a whopping 16 races at the Broadmeadows circuit and will start from box seven in the final.

Bubba's Dream (34.79) and Johnny Ringo (34.94) were also impressive winners, while Destini Fireball looms as one of the main dangers after drawing the coveted red alley.

Monday week's meeting will also see the running of the Group 3 RSN Silver Bullet, with fields to be released on Wednesday.



The Hume Cup was initially called the Lord's Mayors Cup and was first run over 675 yards at North Melbourne in 1960, it moved with the club to Olympic Park and in 1964 became the Lord Mayors Trophy and remained a sprint race until 1988. It then became a distance event until 1994 when it was discontinued. The MGRA due to the tremendous support they are given by the Hume City Council resurrected the feature in 2000 calling the race the Hume Cup. In another change to the event last year it was conducted over 600 metres for the first time and that will remain the distance in the foreseeable future. The race was elevated to Group 1 status this year when prizemoney went to \$75,000 to the winner. Listed below are the past winners.
