# MEDIA RELEASE 23rd July 2017 Brett's two-pronged attack on Maturity Classic Final

Queensland trainer Tony Brett heads into the Group 1 Maturity Classic with two genuine chances after both star galloper Fast Times and the speedy Opal Nera qualified for Saturday's \$145,000 final.

Fast Times – one of five youngsters in the final by Australia's leading sire Barcia Bale – sat behind early leader Aston Dinnigan before powering home to win the third semi-final in 30.14. One race later, Brett bought up the double as Opal Nera won the speed battle in the run to the first corner, holding off a late challenge from Trixta Rox to get home in 30.20.

Brett is no stranger to winning Group 1 races at The Meadows, steering Bogie Leigh to victory in The Meadows' flagship race – the Australian Cup – in 2004 and Black Enforcer in a Topgun success in 2005. However, he's hoping his recent luck in Group 1 finals at The Meadows will change, after his star chaser Thirty Talks led in January's Group 1 Silver Chief final before going amiss down the back straight.

His main rival will be Mepunga Blazer, who set The Meadows alight with a commanding 29.63 semifinal win after amazing splits of 5.04 and 17.48 – the second fastest second split this year behind Lightning Frank's effort in a heat of the Australian Cup. The Jeff Britton-trained chaser was the only greyhound in the semi-final stage to break 30 seconds, but will have to contend with the awkward draw of six in the weekend's \$100,000-to-the-winner final.

The semis got off to a rocky start for punters after Dyna Jerry got up at the odds of \$50.30 on SuperTAB after a fast 4.99 set up his 30.23 victory over the fast finishing Shadale.

Next Saturday's bumper program will also see the running of the Group 3 Destini Fireball Stayers final, where champion stayer Burn One Down will start a short-priced favourite despite going down to the in-form Billy's Bake in the second of the weekend's heats. Mick's Angel gave trainer Allan Meyer his first Group finalist after a fantastic last-to-first win in the opening heat of the series. The daughter of Kilty Lad and Seabrook Lass will start from box eight in the \$25,000-to-the-winner final.

## What is happening on race night?



### Some Maturity fact and figures

Twenty-one favourites have won the Maturity Classic since it was first staged in 1970. Of those ten have started odds on.

The race record at Olympic Park was 29.80 held by Storm Glade, since the race transferred to the Meadows the fastest winner is Fernando Bale in 29.50.

The longest priced winner is Poetic Magic at \$27.40 he won in 2005. The Shortest priced winner is Brett Lee at 1.20 when won in 2001.

Graeme Bate won the race on five occasions with Storm Glade (1985), Hay Dinney (88), Northern Legend (95), Shereen Bale (2011) and Barcia Bale (2012).

The only other trainers to produce more than one winner are Darren McDonald with Brett Lee (2001) and Hallucinate (2004) and Jason Thompson 2007 Run's House and 2009 Aston Trivett.

Some of the most famous winners and most noted start with Temlee (74), Satan's Legend (78), Pharaoh's Mask (86), New Tears (87), Hay Dinney (88), Best Of Blue (89), Eureka Man (90), Northern Legend (95), Coriole (99), Brett Lee (2001), Hallucinate (2004), El Grand Senor (2010) Shereen Bale (2012) Barcia Bale, (2013) Marcus Joe and 2015 winner Fernando Bale.

Winners that have produced winners. Temlee produced Satan's Legend & Murchison Champ, New Tears produced Northern Legend and Brett Lee produced Hallucinate.

Only five bitches have won the Maturity Warrenwood Girl (75), Overflow Love (77), Coriole (99) and Shereen Bale (2011) and 2013 winner Mepunga Hayley.

In the last decade six of the 10 winners started favourite.

The Maturity Classic was first held at Olympic Park in 1970 when won by talented sprinter Phantom's Heir first prize at that time was \$1250. The prizemoney increased marginally until 1975 when it went to \$3,500. In 77 it was \$5,600 and jumped to \$7000 in 79 before going to \$10,000 from 1980 until 1987 the year the mighty New Tears won the race. First prize went to \$15,000 for seven years then to \$20,000 for two years and reached \$30,000 in the year 2000. In 2001 it was worth \$40,000 and the Classic was won by AGRA Hall Of Famer Brett Lee. It was elevated the next year to the amount of \$50,000 and again in 2011 the race increased to \$75,000 to the winner. Then again in 2012 the prizemoney increased to \$100,000 to the winner.
