National Derby & Futurity Wrap

Silver Chief winner Lightning Frank has been installed as the \$2.50 favourite by TAB Fixed odds for next week's National Derby after a brilliant heat win where he lead all the way in 29.96. The front running Victorian has drawn awkwardly in box four but his early speed and box manners should serve him well in the Group 1 final.

However, it's an even race with several chances after the five heats were decided at Sydney headquarters Wentworth Park last night. Fastest heat winner was the Dennis Barnes trained Nangar Rock he returned 29.88 in the last heat proving too good for Big Daddy Dee who qualified as one of the fastest seconds and came up with box one in the final. Nangar Rock wasn't quite as lucky and will wear the yellow rug next week.

Leading Victorian trainer Angela Langton will have two starters in the final with smart youngster Hit The Highway jumping from box three after he won impressively in 29.99 and Duty Free a fastest second behind Lightning Frank, he will exit box two.

Good Odds Bricky came into last night's heat as a reserve flashed along the rails from fourth and fifth in the straight to win his heat in 30.38 he will start the rank outsider at \$31 for trainer Frank Hurst.

The other heat winner was the John Little trained Black Hole Sun he won heat one in 30.57. Big disappointments were Paws of Thunder stars Shima Bar and Falcon's Fury both had no luck and finished unplaced.

Also decided last night were the heats of the National Futurity fastest heat winner was Victorian Up Hill Jill she came into the series with the Group 2 Laurels win at Sandown under her belt and blitzed the opposition with a one act affair winning by 10 lengths in the time standard of the night 29.87.

She has been installed pre-post favourite by Tab Fixed odds at \$2.20 after drawing extremely well in box two.

After missing the start in last week's Paws of Thunder final Striker Light flew out from box six last night and hung on to win in 30.46. She had a massive lead down the back but it was cut short in the run home by fellow Victorian Daithy Allen, she also made the final for Andrea Dailly as a fastest second.

Brett Bravo will have two finalists along with owner George Farrugia after Striker Light's kennel mate Andrea Doria won her heat in 30.12, she will jump from box four in the final.

The other heat winner was the Ashley Dwyer trained Mainline Osti the inform bitch used box one to full advantage qualifying in a PB of 30.12.

Making up the Futurity field are the fastest seconds Red Calibre, Jody Lee Kade and another Victorian visitor Princess Pout for trainer Gavin Clifton, she will be the first Group 1 finalist for the Nar Nar Goon mentor.

Both events are stepped in history the Derby first run in 1963 when won by the mighty Keen Linen and the Futurity run for the first time a year later in 64, when won by Cultured Girl. The races were the NCA's flag ship events for many years and have been won by some of the superstars of the sport.

The National Derby was first run in 1963 and was for a long period the NCA's Group 1 flagship at one time it was worth \$100,000 to the winner. The club changed its direction a few years ago, making the St Ledger better known as the Paws Of Thunder the richer of the two events settling on \$75,000 to the winner for the Derby.
