Two Victorians win the Richmond Classics

BLUE Sky Riot (Barcia Bale x Ready To Riot Feb '16) stamped herself as one of the best bitches in the country with a dominant win in Friday's Group 2 Richmond Oaks (535m).

Trained in Victoria by Anthony Azzopardi, Blue Sky Riot started as the second favourite off box eight and when the lids flew open she made the race her own, carving across to take the lead around the first turn.

Group 1 Topgun winner Up Hill Jill (\$2.20) (Premier Fantasy x Where's Demonica Feb '15) and Bathurst Cup winner Miss Splendamiro (\$4.60) (Barcia Bale x Splendourous Sep '15) quickly slipped into second and third and set off in pursuit of the leader, but Blue Sky Riot was far too strong, winning by two and one quarter lengths in 30.44.

Blue Sky Riot (\$4.30) has now won five in a row including the Group 1 National Futurity at Wentworth Park last month. Azzopardi said his bonny bitch has taken a massive step forward in recent weeks.

"She is a different dog since winning the Futurity. After that trip to Sydney she came home and beat Striker Light at The Meadows and ran best of the night at Sandown Park," Azzopardi told Australian Racing Greyhound.

"She seemed to mature a lot with that trip away and she has surprised me a little bit by just how much she has come on since then.

"It was a massive run in her [Richmond Oaks] heat and she backed it up again in the final – to do what she has done is the sign of a good dog."

Owned and bred by Sandra Camden-Bermingham, Blue Sky Riot has now won nine races from 16 starts with a further four placings and just over \$140,000 in prize money.

She will be on the road again from next week, with her next goal being the \$250,000-to-the-winner Group 1 Golden Easter Egg (520m) at Wentworth Park.

"She has taken the next step, so it's onto the Easter Egg for her now," Azzopardi said.

"She took a bit of time to get used to Wentworth Park, but she has won a group 1 there now so you'd have to give her a chance going back there.

"She'll be going there full of confidence – as long as she keeps beginning well she will be a big threat." Azzopardi will be taking a team of greyhounds to Wentworth Park for the Golden Easter Egg including Group 1 Vic Peters Classic winner Crash Bandicoot (Collision x J's Robin Jul '15) and city winner Pants On Fire (Bralyn County x Erin Norris Jun '15).

Also making the trip to the Harbour City will be Azzopardi's dual group 1 winner Raw Ability (Barcia Bale x Bugatti Flyer Mar '15) which will be having his first start since finishing down the track in the Group 1 Australian Cup final.

"He had no luck in the Australian Cup and he pulled up a bit sore," Azzopardi explained.

"We are on top of that now and he will have a gallop [on Sunday]. All going to plan he should be ready to go for the Egg heats."

The heats of the Group 1 Golden Easter Egg will be held at Wentworth Park on March 17

HONE IN WINS HIS FIRST GROUP RACE IN THE RICHMOND DERBY By Neil Brown

VICTORIAN chaser Hone In scored an upset win when he found the front at the first turn and held off all the challenges to win the Group 2 Richmond Derby on Friday night.

Trainer Brett Bravo was very confident he's greyhound could secure the Richmond Classic.

"He's a very serious greyhound if he's let run his own race, he's not always the best beginner which has probably let him down a bit in the past, but if he gets a nice lead and a fair crack at them he can run time." Bravo said after the final.

"He had some serious injuries two broken metacarpals and recently a damaged hock which kept him out for a 10-week break, but he has come back better than ever. He ran a solid third at Bendigo with no luck first run back from the spell then broke 25 at Ballarat. He'd only had the one 500 run and he had never seen Richmond so we expected him to improve quite a bit."

"I liked his win in the heat he found a bit of trouble last week and still won. I knew he'd be hard to run down once he got a clear run to the first turn which I expected might happen with a little bit of luck." Bravo said.

"We backed to him with the fixed odds and had a nice little collect got as much as 12 to 1 about him. I'm pretty happy with the result not sure if I'll take him to the Easter Egg, he is entered but because of the recent injuries I may not take the risk with him on a tough track like Wentworth Park. We'll see how he is early in the week and make a decision then."

"It's not an easy track at any time and considering what he's been through injury wise I need to look after him a bit." Bravo said.

Bravo has only had Hone In for the last 15 starts when he ended his kennel around October last year. He has always shown above average ability with fast wins at Horsham 27.04, the Meadows 29.95, 28.41 over 500 at Bendigo and that fast-recent Ballarat 450 win in 24.97.

"On his night he's a real smart type just one of those dogs that hasn't had a lot of luck during his career, if we don't go to the Egg I'll just take him along nicely and see what comes he's got a few more wins in him yet." Bravo said.

Hone In (\$7.70) beat bolter Wild Walter (\$31) and Queenslander Maurice Monor (\$13.40). The margins were half a length by two and a quarter in the time of 30.51 with sections of 5.24 and 15.31.

Both Richmond races are steeped in history having first been run in the 50's the early classics were run up the Richmond straight of 320 yards with some Fields numbering 10 runners.

Some of the great champions to have won the Richmond Oaks including Zoom Top & Winifred Bale. While in the Derby past winners include Peter Glider, Rapid Supreme, Buka Sunset, Cyrus The Virus and Mandagery man.

After the placings in the Derby the field finished in the following order 4th Aston Duke (\$2), 5th Aston Frankel (\$8.30), 6th Two Times Twice (\$4.80) 7th Aston It Is (\$11) and Big Black (\$25.80).

Hone In is raced by the Stephen Lambert and trained by Brett Bravo at Lovely Banks in Victoria, he is a Red Fawn dog whelped October 2014 by Spring Gun from Benalla Doll (Where's Pedro x Redburst). Hone In has won 17 and been placed 16 times from his 53 starts and with the \$40,000 first prize for the Richmond Derby it took his current stake earnings to \$93,870.

After the placings in the Oaks the field finished in the following order 4th My Country (\$36.20), 5th Chase The Cash (\$45.50), 6th Poco Dorado (\$6.10) 7th Little Nangar (\$24.90) and Sheez My Chicki (\$35).

Blue Sky Riot is raced by Sandra Camden-Bermingham and is trained by Anthony Azzopardi, she is a Blue bitch whelped February 2016 by Barcia Bale from Ready To Riot (Collision x Punk Angel). Blue Sky Riot has won nine of her 16 starts and has been placed on four occasions and with the \$40,000 first prize for the Richmond Oaks it took her current stake earnings to \$140,735.
